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General Rate Case Decision

On July 8, 2004, the California Public Utilities Commission issued a final decision in S California Edison Company's 2003 general rate case. Southern California Edison is the largest su Edison International. The general rate case decision authorized an annual increase of approximatin base rates. Southern California Edison had requested an increase of about \$250 million.

The decision is retroactive to May 22, 2003, when the decision initially was forecasted The balance in the account established to record the recovery of the authorized rate increase simulated by the recovered in rates over the next 12 months. To stabilize customer rates, Southern California Edison estimates that the outcome of this consolidated rate decision will decrease averaged bundled service customers by 0.34%.

The general rate case decision approves nearly all of Southern California Edison's requeits multi-billion infrastructure investment program through 2005. This program is essential to plevels of electric grid reliability. The decision also establishes revenue adjustments for 2004 cost escalation and planned capital investments.

The decision rejects Southern California Edison's requested increase in depreciation to disposal costs of retired equipment, instead choosing to shift recovery of about \$114 million and years. The balance of the reduction in Southern California Edison's request is primarily in the capital-related ratemaking adjustments of about \$42 million, and operations and maintenance expendition.

While Southern California Edison's case was pending before the California Public Utiliti the company identified \$28 million of supplemental costs being incurred above the general rate can The commission's final decision did not recognize these cost increases, which are primarily in the transmission and distribution operations. Southern California Edison intends to review its operation align its costs with the authorized revenues.

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Southern California Edison is planning to submit a notice of intent for its 2006 general summer and then file a formal application in the fall once it has met the California Public Utili Commission's standard for completeness. In this upcoming application, Southern California Edison request to establish appropriate levels of operating and depreciation expenses.
